RE: Convert the Upper and Lower DeFord Trail to an ADA compliant trail.

Meg Bishop, Secretary

The HCC recommends the conversion of the Upper and Lower DeFord Trail to an ADA compliant trail that would accommodate wheelchairs. Given the low-gradient nature of what is called the "wood-chip trail," the Lower DeFord trail is perfectly suited to expanding the accessibility of open-space trails to persons with disabilities and/or mobility issues (whether temporary or permanent). It is currently often used by a many multi-generational families with varying ability levels. Adding access to the Upper DeFord Trail would extend options for those who wish to challenge themselves. The total distance for this trail would be approximately 1.5 miles. We are hoping this project serves as the start of a broader effort to enhance the livability of our community for everyone.

Discussions identified the opportunities for use by other users such as families, those of advanced age, and other types of slow users.

A vote was taken at the October 28th meeting of HCC: 19 Yea and 1 Nay The recommendation is approved.

Meg Bishop (HCC Secretary) has discussed this proposal with various representatives of groups advocating for persons with disabilities and/or mobility issues and they are quite excited and are interested in being involved in some way, including a focus on creation of a project area. Those include:
