

KNOW YOUR EVACUATION ROUTES

When evacuations are requested or ordered, it is important that you respond quickly and responsibly. While evacuating, you need to understand where the threat is located and what evacuation route is most appropriate. Also remember, first responders may be utilizing evacuation routes. Always make room for fire engines, ambulances and law enforcement vehicles while safely leaving the area.

TEMPORARY REFUGE AREAS

If evacuation routes are obstructed by smoke, incoming emergency equipment, or directly threatened by fire, you should utilize a temporary refuge area. Examples include, behind a retaining wall, large lawn, or parking area.

EMERGENCY PLANNING CHECKLIST

- 2. Learn your evacuation routes and practice an evacuation with your household (including animals).
- 3. Review your emergency plan annually to ensure its up to date.
