The proposed project will replace an existing failed pump station located between the two existing primary clarifiers and the additional underground piping between the pump station and main control building. The pump station is used to transport scum and floatable material from clarifiers at the city's wastewater treatment plant. Replacement of the existing pump will improve treatment and reduce operation and maintenance efforts by plant employees. All work is proposed within the boundaries of the City of Helena Wastewater Treatment Facility.

Pursuant to ARM 17.40.318, the Department has concluded that the proposed project meets the Categorical Exclusion criteria of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the Montana Environmental Policy Act (MEPA). 
